### The number 7

#### Facts of the Number 7 in the Enoch Calendar

The Enoch Calendar is based entirely on the divine rhythm of seven — the number of creation, completion, and sanctification. Every week, season, and year follows this unbroken pattern, ensuring the 364-day solar calendar aligns perfectly with the weekly Sabbath.

#### 1. Seven-Day Creation Pattern

The Enoch Calendar follows the original seven-day week from Genesis. The seventh day is always the Sabbath — a perpetual day of rest. Each quarter (season) contains 13 complete weeks (91 days), producing exactly 52 Sabbaths per year. This structure makes 7 the foundational unit of timekeeping.

#### 2. Structure of Sevens in the Year

Each quarter equals 91 days ( $13 \times 7$ ). Four quarters total 364 days — exactly 52 weeks ( $7 \times 52$ ). Each quarter ends with a Tequphah (seasonal turning), maintaining perfect balance without drift.

#### 3. Sabbaths and Sevens

The calendar identifies 52 Sabbaths, numbered 1 through 52, confirming an unbroken seven-day rhythm across the year. This structure demonstrates the sacred completeness of time ordained by Yahuah.

#### 4. The Seventh Month and Its Appointments

The seventh month (Ethanim/Tishri) holds the highest concentration of sacred feasts: - Day 1: Feast of Trumpets (Yom Teruah) - Day 10: Day of Atonement (Yom Kippurim) - Days 15–22: Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot) These festivals mark divine completion and restoration.

#### 5. Occurrences of the Number 7

Within the 364-day count, the digit 7 appears in 63 distinct day numbers and 66 total occurrences (because numbers like 77, 177, and 277 contain two 7s). This repetition symbolizes perfection and divine order across all time cycles.

#### 6. Spiritual Symbolism of 7

In Hebrew and Enochic understanding, 7 represents divine completion and covenant. The sevenfold division governs creation, Sabbaths, feasts, and even heavenly motion — reflecting the Creator's design.
