

****THE BESORAH SEED — SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS**

FOR FOLLOWING THE ENOCH 364-DAY CALENDAR
(With the Special 7× Pattern of the Weekly Sabbaths)**

At **The Besorah Seed**, we love the peaceful rhythm of the Enoch Calendar. It is simple enough for beginners, yet deep enough for lifelong study. These gentle instructions will help you follow the calendar easily — step by step — just as it was designed from the beginning.

★ **Every Weekly Sabbath falls on a day-of-year that is a multiple of 7.**

Why?

Because **Weekly Sabbath Number** × 7 = **Sabbath Day-of-Year**.

1. Begin With the Spring Equinox — The First Sign in the Heavens

The year begins when the sun crosses the ecliptic.

- **Day 1 of the Year** (red number 1)
- **Day 1 of Month 1**
- **Start of Sabbath Week 1**

2. Understanding the Red Numbers

The **red numbers** on the calendar show the **day of the year** — 1 through 364.

Because Sabbaths fall every 7 days, every seventh red number marks a Sabbath.

- **Sabbath 26**
 $26 \times 7 = 182$ (Exactly the halfway point of the year — right before the Fall Equinox!)
- **Sabbath 52**
 $52 \times 7 = 364$
The last Sabbath always falls on **Day 364**, the final counted day of the year.

! **Why these matters:**

This 7×Sabbath pattern is **impossible** in any lunar or man-made calendar.
It only works in a **364-day, 52-week**, divinely structured system.

This is one of the strongest natural confirmations that the Enoch Calendar preserves the original design.

4. Appointed-Day Sabbaths — The Moedym

These special festival Sabbaths, fall precisely onto fixed day-counts:

- **Day 14 — Passover** (Sabbath $2 \times 7 =$ Day 14)
- **Days 15–21 — Unleavened Bread**
- **Day 22 — First Fruits**
- **Day 50 — Shavuot**
- **Day 1 of Month 7 — Trumpets**
- **Day 10 of Month 7 — Atonement**

- **Days 15–21 of Month 7 — Sukkot**
- **Day 22 — The Eighth Day**

Because the weekly rhythm is so stable, these Appointed Days never drift out of place.

5. The Yearly Flow — Simple and Gentle

Each season contains:

- 30 days
 - 30 days
 - 30 days
 - 1 seasonal marker day
- Total = **91 days**

Four seasons = **364 days**.

The marker days keep the seasons aligned while leaving the monthly structure untouched.

6. Following the Calendar Step by Step

Step 1 — Watch for the Spring Equinox

Next day becomes **Day 1**.

Step 2 — Track the red numbers

They show you where you are in the 1–364 cycle.

Step 4 — Observe the Moedym

They fall on the same numbers every year.

Step 5 — Begin Month 7 at the Fall Equinox

Day 365 is a divider day, preparing the cycle to restart.
